

# Sometimes 'Y'

We all know that A, E, I, O and U are the vowels, but sometimes, there's Y. At the end of a one syllable word, Y is long-i (as in sky or cry), at the end of a multiple syllable word it is long-e (as in funny or happy). Inside a word, Y is usually short-i (as in cymbals).

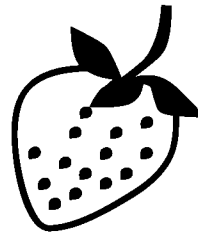
'Y' says short-i



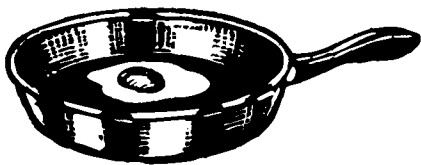
